



Lenny Walter Frazier

August 26, 1959 - January 23, 2019

Leonard Walter Frazier passed away Wednesday, January 23, following a courageous battle with pancreatic cancer. Lenny, 59, was a native of New Orleans and a longtime resident of Chalmette. He is survived by his beloved wife of thirty-six years, Sharon Faust Frazier, and his three sons; Lenny (Lauren), Lance (Mollie), and Cory. He was a loving grandfather to Victoria, Jean, Brynn, Lenny, Sadie, Jude, Lauralye, Cory, and Beau. Lenny worked at Kentwood Springs before joining the Domino Sugar family, serving as a National Accounts Manager until his death. Lenny treasured his Catholic faith and was a devoted member of Group 16 at Manresa House of Retreats for thirty years. His big smile, positive attitude, and caring personality served as a source of friendship and comfort for all who knew him.
