Albert "Al" M. Robinson passed away at his residence on Saturday, January 14, 2012 at the age of 78. He was a native of Philadelphia, PA and a resident of Kenner, LA. He served in the U.S. Navy and Airforce in Korea and was a member of the American Legion. He coached and reffed sports. He was a member of the Greater New Orleans Football Association (GNOFA) and coached baseball for the Special Olympics. He was known as the "Zephyr's greatest fan." He was proprietor of the Mustang Café and after the baseball games Craig, Doc, Chris and I would visit with St. Al at the Café drinking beers and talking about baseball and life. I made him a T-Shirt that said, "St. Al, Proprietor Mustang Cafe". He loved it and wore it often to the ball games. He loved his puppies Chipper (who is now with St. Al), Finnegan and Meghan. He loved the 4th of July because it commemorated the birth of our country, but also, and even more special, it was his wife's birthday. He made birthdays special. I remember one year for Doc's birthday, St. Al arranged to have Doc throw out the first pitch and for Doc to be guest radio announcer during the ballgame. That was pretty awesome.
