David Randall "Randy" Rumbelow, Jr. passed away peacefully in his sleep on August 29th, 2016 at his home in Kenner, Louisiana. He was born in Winnsboro, Louisiana on April 27th, 1949 to David Sr. and Eleanor Rumbelow, and was the youngest of three children.

Randy was raised in Williston, North Dakota and Metairie, Louisiana. He was a 1967 graduate of East Jefferson High School, and a veteran of the United States Army. He attended the Berklee College of Music and ultimately received bachelor's and master's degrees in music from Northwestern State University and Southeastern Louisiana University, respectively.

In 1972, Randy married the former Sharon Lynn Wilson of New Orleans, Louisiana. They were devotedly married for forty four years, and had three children together.

Randy was a jazz and classically trained pianist, and a lifelong advocate of music education. He taught chorus, band, and piano at public and parochial schools across the New Orleans area for over 30 years, serving 15 of those years at Our Lady of Prompt Succor, in Chalmette, Louisiana.

Randy served as a faithful member of Williams Boulevard Baptist Church since 1982, where he was the pianist and a leader in the music program for over 25 years. Surrounded by family and friends, he there set two Guinness World Records in continuous piano and organ playing. In his leisure time, he enjoyed coaching his children's sports teams and visiting his family's hometown of Grand Saline, Texas.

He is survived by his wife, Sharon; his three children: Melanie (Paul) Kihnel, David (Rachel) Rumbelow III, and Brandon (Chandra) Rumbelow; his two sisters: Jackie Rumbelow and Billie Collier; and nine grandchildren: Megan Kihnel, Ashlyn Kihnel, Ethan Kihnel, Logan Kihnel, Brian Kihnel, Lance Rumbelow, Thomas Rumbelow, Emma Grace Rumbelow, and Caroline Rumbelow.

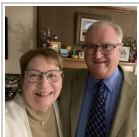
