Edattukaran K. Stanley, 77, passed away peacefully on September 9th, 2019. Born in Kerala, India, he was the youngest son of Kochuthoman and Rosa Edattukaran. After practicing medicine in India for 6 years, he, his wife Lucy Stanley, and their daughter Smitha Stanley immigrated to the United States. He completed his Pediatrics residency at Tulane University and was in private practice for 36 years in Metairie. He took care of thousands of kids, their kids, and their grandkids, treating three generations in the same family.

He enjoyed traveling and visited every continent. He loved playing endless games of 56, and endlessly debating the strategy of the game. During Mardi Gras, he could always be found on the median side, covered in beads, with a minimum of 3 Zulu coconuts. We still don't know how he got so many coconuts. He was always ready for a party, and he loved entertaining. He was known for his Cosmos and Margaritas, and in 2014, he was perfecting the Stanley Sazerac.

He is survived by his wife, Lucy Stanley, and his two children and their families, a daughter and son-in-law, Smitha and AJ Paul of Metairie, Louisiana, and their kids Isabella and David, and his son and daughter-in-law, Tom Stanley and Aarthi Vijaykumar of Inverness, Illinois and their kids Dhilan and Raya.

He is also survived by the Kerala community of New Orleans, which he and his wife helped to found and continue.

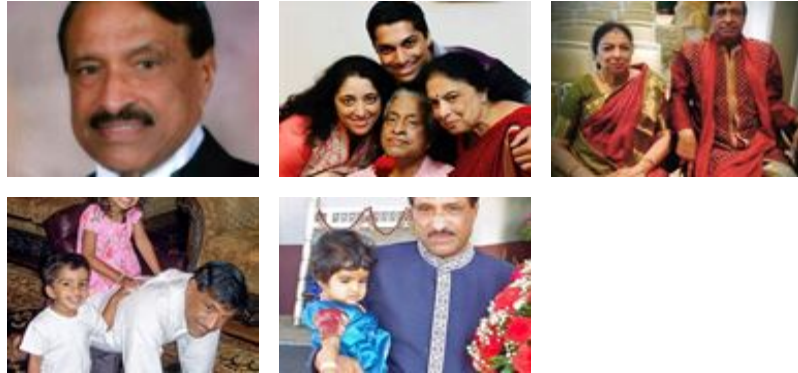

“ Dr. E. K. STANLEY, NEW ORLEANS (NOTEWORTHY MEMORIES)

E. C. SAMKUTTY, LOUISIANA

10 SEPTEMBER 2019

A few years ago, one of the pastors and his wife that I knew were traveling back to their home in Texas. High up in the Louisiana skies, this pastor got seriously ill.

The airliner quickly landed in the New Orleans International Airport to provide him emergency treatment. Once he was brought in the ambulance to the hospital, they tried to revive him. I realized later that he was already dead before arrival at the hospital.

I live about 112 kilometers away from the New Orleans Airport.

I called my Catholic friends Dr. E. K. Stanley and Mr. Basil Thoppil and informed them of the sad situation of this pastor and his wife.

It did not take but a second for these two gentlemen to respond.

Stanley, Basil Thoppil and his wife Molly, quickly got dressed late at night, rushed to the hospital which was more than a dozen kilometers away from their homes. The Emergency Room doctors tried to revive him but were not successful.

In the midnight hour, Stanley and Basil personally met with the pastor's wife in the hospital. Molly comforted the bereaved wife with a lingering embrace and sat with her until her family members arrived from Texas. The three Keralites spent a lot of time talking to the physicians who attended the pastor and caring for his wife in shock and tears.

They gave their phone numbers to the pastor's wife and asked her to call them if she needed any further assistance.

These gentlemen were very quick to respond to the needs of their fellow beings.

I was very impressed with the way this busy medical doctor responded to the tragedy of a pastor and his wife in the late hours of the night.

They did not even know the couple that they wholeheartedly reached out to help.

Dr. Stanley was very dedicated to his mother-church---the Catholic Church--- but treated all people with love and respect regardless of

their denominational or religious affiliations.

Dr. Stanley's and his wife Lucy's, warm, caring and cordial nature has touched the lives of a countless number of people. Pushpa and I have personally enjoyed the fellowship and hospitality in their home.

His death is a great loss to the Keralite Community.
