Elwood Briward "Henry" Stow, Jr. passed away peacefully at his home in Kenner on Tuesday, March 8, 2022. He was 82. A native New Orleanian, Henry lived his younger childhood years on St. Philip Street in the French Quarter, until his family relocated to the Irish Channel. He graduated with the class of 1957 from St. Aloysius High School in New Orleans, and proudly served in the United States Marine Corps Reserves. He then married the love of his life, Jean Margaret Lemoine Stow, in 1961. He enjoyed a decade's long profession in the beverage alcohol industry, as both a distributor and supplier. He worked for Strauss, Magnolia and Christian Brothers, until he retired after 25 years of service with Bacardi Imports. He formed strong relationships with his customers, business associates and competitors alike. Henry will always be respected for his tenacious work ethic and unfaltering commitment to excellence.
