Louis Gregory Nadau duTreil died on Sunday, October 2, 2011 from complications of liver failure after an 18 year battle with sarcoidosis. Greg was married to Katherine Reilly of Kankakee, IL for 33 years. His beloved wife was with him when he passed away at home.

Greg was born February 1, 1947 in New Orleans and preceded in death by his parents Louis Paul III and Ethel Miller duTreil. He is survived by three brothers, one sister and numerous nieces and nephews. Greg was President of duTreil Pest Control Inc. from 1978 until Hurricane Katrina.

He was an avid animal lover, but also received the first Nuisance Wildlife Trappers License in the State of Louisiana. He provided and placed insects, snakes and various other forms of unique wildlife in locally shot films, TV shows, and commercials.
