Having been a member of the 400th Military Police Battalion in the U.S. Army from December 1942 until January 1947, Harris participated in the African, Middle Eastern, and European Campaigns. One such campaign landed him on the Utah Beach in Normandy, France during the invasion on D-Day. Before being honorably discharged from the army, Harris Dardar was awarded the following: the Silver Rifle and four Battle Stars, the Bronze Arrowhead and the World War II Victory Medal, the Good Conduct Medal, the European-African-Middle Eastern Campaign Medal and the World War II Victory Ribbon. After years of service both in and out of the army, Harris Dardar retired at the age of 80. Those who knew him will say that he worked tirelessly, loved sincerely, and will continue to be respected by many.
