Harry E. Lindsey, Jr. was an educator. He began his career in the Orleans Parish Public Schools System and then the Archdiocese of New Orleans Catholic Schools, for a total of forty-one years. He died on Saturday, February 12, 2022, surrounded by his loving family, from complications of squamous cell carcinoma. He valiantly gave his best fight for over two years. He was 70 years of age. Mr. Lindsey was born in New Orleans and lived in Jefferson Parish for forty-nine years. He was born in 1951 to Melba and Harry Lindsey, Sr. He attended St. Maurice Elementary School, Holy Cross High School and UNO, where he obtained his B. S. degree. He was an avid powerlifter and had many Masters State records. He enjoyed camping, fishing and travel. Survivors include his wife of 47 years, Elizabeth (Betty) Lindsey, a son David E. Lindsey (Abby), and one granddaughter, Taylor. Also survived by his sister Diane (Mike) Pollock. Preceded in death by his parents, Harry and Melba Lindsey and sister, Patricia A. Otilio.
