Henry "Hank" J. Polito, Jr. went to be with his Heavenly Father on Wednesday, March 4th 2015, at the age of 84. He was a lifelong resident of Kenner. Hank is survived by his loving wife Martha of 57 years, three children Robbie (Debbie), Missy (Craig), Sandy (Robert), 7 grandchildren Priscilla, Rochelle, Katie (Jay), Tabitha (Derek), RJ, Trey, Alyssa, two step-grandchildren Brandi and Josh, and four great-grandchildren Ashton, Gavin, Michelle and Michael Brennan. With a love for God, his country, fellow man, and community, Hank served as a deacon at Williams Blvd. Baptist Church where he was involved in Silver Stars, Special Ministries, and Bus Ministry. Hank continued his life of service as a police officer of the Kenner Police Department for 20 years and was also a founding member of the KPA and a member of the FOP. Hank also served 10 years with the Jefferson Parish Sheriff's Office, 35 years as a school bus driver, president of the LSU Police Officers Alumni Association, life member of the LA State Fireman's Association, lifetime member of the Kenner Volunteer Fire Department, and Commander of Kenner's Veterans of Foreign Wars Post 7732 for 42 years. He touched lives where ever he went and never met a stranger. He was a role model, loving husband, father, grandfather, and will be missed greatly.
