“ If Mr. Otnott had not helped me in 1969, I would likely not be here today. I was a Junior at L.S.U.N.O now U.N.O. The local draft board had in error, dropped my full time student deferment. All of my calls and letters, accomplished nothing. I asked for Mr. Otnott's help. He immediately sat down with me and called Senator Russell Long and Rep. Hal Boggs and explained the draft boards error and their refusal to review the facts. Three days later I received my copy of Senator Long's letter and Rep. Boggs letter to my draft board asking them to review the facts of my case. Five days later they followed up asking why they haven't responded. A week later, the Draft Board said that they had made an error.

I owe Mr. Otnott A LOT. Many of my friends returning from the service had no job. Mr. Otnott, in every case was able to put them to work on a milk truck, delivering milk to homes and businesses. Those jobs meant a lot and I know they would also want to say THANKS.

Mr. Otnott taught me many early life lessons, that I still value today.

I'm sure he's now delivering milk to all the Saints in heaven from his favorite horse.
