Jane Andrae Vetter passed away at her home on August 25, 2019 surrounded by family and friends. She was born in Jefferson City, Missouri on February 18, 1941 to Henry Andrae and Helen Walton Andrae. She graduated from Gulf Park College, Gulfport, Mississippi and the University of Missouri. She married Thomas A. Vetter on February 19, 1966. Active in a variety of local and state organizations, she was a member of the Tuesday Club and served on the Board of the Friends of the Library of the University of Missouri. Jane was also a member of the Chancellor's Residence Preservation Committee that oversaw the restoration of that building at the University of Missouri and was also an active member of the Key West Harry S. Truman Foundation. She was a co-owner of Cote Sans Dessein Antiques which specialized in estate sales and antique valuations. Jane was an avid tennis player, accomplished interior designer and passionate gardener.

She is survived by her husband Tom, her daughter Walton Goldring of New Orleans, Walton's husband Jeffrey and their sons Stephen and Zachary, and her son Thomas Alex Vetter, Jr. of Chicago, Alex's wife Johanna and their children Henry and Ana. She also survived by her sisters Mary Pool and Helen Harrison, and was predeceased by her sister, Carol Andrae.
