Jeffrey Charles Collins, Sr., a New Orleans lawyer whose passions included blues music, art and cooking, passed away on Friday, April 13, 2012 at the age of 55 years. Loving father of Jeffrey Collins, Jr. of New Orleans and Jennifer Collins of Metairie. Devoted grandfather of Lilly Grace Stone. Also survived by his ex wife, Brenda Collins-Parker of Mandeville, his aunt, Jaqueline Atkins (Ed) of Albany, New York, and his brother, Randall Collins (Arlette) of Benton, AK, as well as many friends and colleagues. Jeffrey was born April 7, 1957, to Leonard and Audrey Collins on an Army base in Furstenfeldbrook, Germany, moving to Metairie when he was four months old. He attended Christian Brothers School, De la Salle High School (Class of 1975) and graduated from Tulane University and Tulane University Law School. A long time resident of Mandeville, Jeffrey was head of the Civil Division at the St. Tammany Justice Center under Malise Prieto for several years before becoming Chief Deputy Clerk of Court for the Supreme Court of Louisiana in 2002, at which time he relocated back to the Southshore. A Funeral Service will be held on Thursday, April 19, 2012 at L. A. Muhleisen & Son Funeral Home, 2929 Metairie Road, Metairie at 11:00 AM with visitation beginning at 9:00 AM.
