“ *Uncle Johnny was our neighbor on Betz Avenue when I was born in New Orleans. He's been a family friend for more than 30 years and when we moved away he stayed in touch. He was quick with a joke and could tell you how to find anyone or anything in New Orleans through some back road. He was a character in my childhood memories, mostly in fantastical stories told around dinner tables by my parents, stories I never tired of hearing. He was there when I came back to New Orleans for college, lending a hand moving mattresses down the interstate, picking me up for a school project, and toasting at my 21st birthday party. He loved to tell the story about how he got to have the steak dinner at Oschner with my mom after I was born because dad was a resident and had to go back to the hospital. He was honest and sometimes tackless, but he'd never hesitate to help you, regardless of the personal cost to him. He loved coffee dates at Wendy's at 5am, road trips to the casino, and driving little old ladies to church. I never had a conversation with Uncle Johnny where he wasn't bragging about his friends and family or boasting about their accomplishments as if they were his own. He'd never let something like a broken hip stop him from celebrating at your wedding. We're all a little bit of a better person because we knew Uncle Johnny.*
