The love of her New Orleans Catholic Sicilian traditions continued throughout her life by participating in the Good Friday "9 churches" walks and attending St Joseph Day Altars with her daughter and grandchildren. She attended St. Michaels and St Teresa grammar schools, SJ Peters Jr High, and graduated from Warren Easton High School in 1968. Shortly after graduation she married

her high school sweetheart Phillip Donaghey, the father of her four children. Despite later divorcing, they remained close throughout life. She built many lifelong friendships and enjoyed her work for many years as a customer service representative at Sears Clearview, as well as a sales representative for BellSouth Yellow Pages, later becoming LM Berry Company where she retired.

Judy was a natural hostess. Never to turn down an opportunity to open her home to friends and family for gatherings such as Easter Saturday celebrations, birthday parties, St Joseph Day altars, Pokeno and card games. She affectionately became known as the "cake nazi" as apparently she was the only one who knew how to correctly slice a birthday cake. Her empathetic nature also compelled her to open her home to both people and dogs who found themselves homeless, often at the expense of her own health and wellbeing. She gave without expecting anything in return. Judy never met a stranger. People felt at ease with her and enjoyed her personable and friendly personality. In addition to her Pokeno games, she enjoyed Mardi Gras, St Patrick's Day Parades on Metairie Road, Christmas in the Oaks, spending countless nights at Tiffin Inn with cousins and extended family, enjoying time and innumerable activities and sleepovers with her grandchildren, taking Taylor to get snowballs and go to Lafreniere Park and to the movies, as well as going to Nick's house for gourmet dinners, crawfish boils, and get-togethers.
