Lloyd R. Brackney died on Wednesday, April 4, 2018. Lloyd is survived by sisters, Margaret Brackney Turner, Alice Brackney and brother, Robert L. Brackney (Donna) all of Pontiac, IL. He was preceded in death by his parents, Charles and Cora Brackney, brother, Charles E. Brackney (Maxine), sister, Mary Brackney Bryant and his twin brother, Floyd K. Brackney. Also survived by many greatly loved nieces and nephews. He will be missed by good friends Joseph Berthelot, Robert DeRoche, Molly and Buddy.

Lloyd was born in Pontiac, Illinois and received his Bachelor of Music Education degree from Illinois Wesleyan University and his Masters Degree from Loyola University in New Orleans. He directed Middle, Jr. High and High School bands during his career. While serving in the U.S. Army he directed the 113th Army training unit band. After teaching for 24 years at Roosevelt Middle School in Kenner, LA he retired in 1994.

After retiring, he was active as a music adjudicator and clinician in Southeast Louisiana. He was a member of Music Educators National Convention, Louisiana Music Educators Association, Phi Mu Alpha Sinfonia, and Kappa Delta Pi. He was also a past president of the Jefferson Parish Band Directors Association. Lloyd rode in Mardi Gras as King Pygmalion I during its inaugural parade in 2000. He will miss the "Old Men's Club" at Lakeside Shopping Center where they have for many years solved most of the world's problems. He was cremated and no services are planned. Arrangements by L. A. You taught us all so much more than music... there were lessons of discipline, respect and striving for a goal. You were a strict teacher with a caring soul. I remember how you would personally drive so many of the band students home after practice. I also remember how when I would have parties for the students at my house, we would always invite you.... and you and my parents would sit in the kitchen and visit, talk and eat while the "kids" all played. You also lived close to the parade route in Metairie back then and invited all the students and their families for hot dogs at your house during the parade. Very brave of you.

I was married when you retired and was so happy and honored to be part of a group of students who had a retirement party for you. The last time I saw you was at Lakeside Shopping Center a few years ago.

I will always remember you and be thankful our paths crossed in this lifetime. I wish there were services so I could pay my respects... by my faith tells me you know how I feel. I am confident there are many who feel the same way.

I hope you enjoy much music in heaven, there is no doubt you will be making the angels sit on the edge of their chairs, with their backs straight, pushing them to play their best making beautiful music while you wave your conductors wand with energy, passion and much kindness of heart.
