Lloyd P. Legendre Sr., beloved husband, father and “Pop”, entered eternal life on May 19, 2026, at the age of 88 in River Ridge, LA.

Born September 20, 1937, in Raceland, Louisiana, to Alphonse Legendre and Eva Arcement Legendre, he grew up in Raceland, LA and Columbia Heights, MN and graduated from Columbia Heights High School in 1956.

Lloyd married Mary Jean LeBas on November 4, 1961, and together they made their home in River Ridge, LA where they raised three children. He spent 22 years managing the One Stop Record Shop in New Orleans. His final years of work were spent at Avondale Shipyards.

Lloyd was known for his unwavering devotion to his LSU Tigers. He enjoyed watching anything that was classified as a sport; football, baseball, hockey and racing were his favorites. He and Jean were avid campers since retirement. They traveled all over the United States and Canada meeting friends old and new. Some of the most memorable trips were to watch the Tigers play in Hoover, AL and Omaha, NE for the College World Series. Lloyd

never met a stranger and many conversations started with a “Go Tigers!” comment about his LSU hat or shirt. He was an active member of Our Lady of Perpetual Help Parish in Kenner, LA. Lloyd was a member of the Men’s Club when his children were young and in retirement helped at the church food pantry.

He is survived by his children Eva (Mike), Regina (Finley), and Lloyd Jr. (Rachael), his grandchildren Oliver Michael (Audra), Natalie (Jeffrey), Carey (Colby), Harleigh (Blake), Emily, Baileigh (Rick), Griffin, and twelve great-grandchildren. He was preceded in death by his wife Mary Jean.
