Lolita Domingo Armit-Dunning (Aunt Lee) entered into eternal rest on Sunday, July 17, 2016 at 88 years of age. She was born on March 16, 1928 in New Orleans, LA to the late Andrew C. She always wanted to help people and give back any way she could. She was a volunteer Eucharistic Minister at East Jefferson General Hospital for many years until her health no longer allowed. She met so many people and made many friends in all those years. She was a member of NARFE and a parishioner of Our Lady of Divine Providence, Metairie, LA. Although Lolita was not blessed with children of her own, she was like a mother to her loving nieces and nephew, Margaret Hartley Tornabene (Richard), Dianne Hartley Quiggle, Thomas Hartley (Sharon), Andrea Hartley Butler (Jim) and Vivian Carriere Adams. She loved them all as her own and that love carried over to their children and grandchildren. She is also survived by her loving cousin Jacqueline Spiers Edwards who was her very first "daughter" as well as other cousins, nieces and nephews in-law whom she dearly loved. Lolita never met a stranger and was loved by everyone. For the past three years she was a resident of Nouveau

Marc Retirement Community where she reigned as queen of their Mardi Gras Ball in 2014. As her health declined, she was lovingly cared for by Vinetta Dabney and the staff of Attentive Companions Home Care and Heart of Hospice. Lolita was a very devout Catholic and loved God above all.
