“ One of the most difficult and highly personal truths about my momma was her profound guilt that her body was unable to carry 3 pregnancies which resulted in miscarriages. She didn't think of them as miscarriages, she thought of them as her children, and now she is finally reunited with them along with Brian. In addition, she had lingering guilt when her doctor informed her that she required a hysterectomy. I say all of this because I had the profound responsibility of being her 1st born in-between the failed pregnancies. I was somewhat of the experimental child destined to be spoiled slightly less with each birth of my other siblings, so that mom could spread out her love equally to us and our father. I was also the little brother to my spiritual siblings and eventually the big brother to my 4 other siblings.

In some ways momma grew up with us kids in a bygone era of innocence, especially when compared to the present time in history. We were somewhat of a real life version of the Brady Bunch - of Kansas Ave. Our home was grand central station and Loretta's Tavern was THE place for all the neighborhood kids, friends, and relatives. We had no idea how spoiled we were or how we would later in life cherish our childhood which would have literally been impossible without momma and the love she gave us.

Being a loving, full-time mother is momma's legacy. Her children, grandchildren, great grandchildren, and resultant offspring into the future, are the beneficiaries of her example of love. This love was fashioned by her Catholic upbringing and momma's acceptance of her spiritual responsibilities to maintain her soul. Naturally, our family attended church faithfully every Sunday.

Sometimes there is a fine line between conscientiousness and guilt. Mom was somewhat of an expert in walking that fine line, using any feelings of guilt as a learning tool in her arsenal to face life's challenges.

Without hesitation, mom was the matriarch of our entire family. The pain her survivors feel at her passing will surely linger but it will be lessened by character formed by her love. We cherish our momma's



love, given unconditionally, and are filled with gratefulness that the love can never be taken away from us. It lives in us as a sign of mom's salvation and the yearning we have to join her one day. I'm so proud of you ma, and I will always love you. There is no more pain and suffering. You are now free, and may you rest in peace.

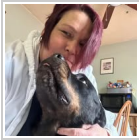
