She was also instrumental in my love for classic cinema. If I ever had a classic cinema question she'd always be the first person I talked to. She introduced me to so much.

She was always so encouraging to me in whatever I was doing. She'd send me random gifts and notes once I moved away. And I still have everything she ever sent me.

Like I stated earlier not only was Michelle an incredible aunt but she was so much more - a sister, a friend, a confidant - she was all of that to me and more. This isn't goodbye, because when we meet again I know she's going to greet me with a "Hello Naomi".
