He was so handsome and in later years when I saw Patrick Swayze in Dirty Dancing I thought he was Terry's Clone! He loved my sister's son, Hunkey, and we often took him to the Lakefront, the park and other fun places. Once when we had an argument, he ran and got his father's milk truck and chased me (in my car) all over Metairie. We laughed about that a few years ago when we talked on the phone; what a sight THAT must have been! The last time I saw Terry was at his mother's funeral and he still had that beautiful smile and that crazy laugh. We spoke on the phone a couple of times after that remembering the 60's and the fun we all had back then. I wish I would have called him again.
